The school follows the European Schools' curriculum and delivers the European Baccalaureate diploma.

## The European Schools and Accredited European Schools

The European Schools and the Accredited European Schools are educational institutions set up in the European Union's Member States. They provide children with a multilingual and multicultural education at Nursery, Primary and Secondary levels.

The schools follow a specific curriculum and offer the European Baccalaureate diploma.

The European Schools came into being in 1953 and were established to promote the mobility of European officials. The aim of the school is to promote continuity in the education career of the children of European officials. The education is designed to ensure that, after a stay abroad, children can easily enrol in a school in their home country or can continue their school career at European School in another European country. Therefore, such schools are established where European institutions and agencies are located.

The Accredited European Schools are schools which, without forming part of the network of European Schools organised by the intergovernmental organisation 'The European Schools,' offer a European education that meets the pedagogical requirements laid down for the European Schools but within the framework of the national school networks of the Member States and hence outside the legal, administrative, and financial framework to which the European Schools are compulsorily subject.

There are currently 13 European Schools and 20 Accredited European Schools located in different Member States of the European Union.

## **MySchool**



From the school year 2020-2021, the whole school is using **MySchool** as a school management software. MySchool is a third-party information system for storage of studyand school-related information (grades, comments, notifications, homework, tests' schedule and scores, subject content of lessons, absences, late arrivals, study reports, communication and contact details).

MySchool is used for similar purposes by all type 1 European Schools, and this brings our school closer to the services provided by European Schools. The services are available to users over the Internet and provide formal, study-related information and broad

data statistics to the school management.

## School rules and other school documents

## **School Rules**

The school rules at TES apply to all staff members, pupils, and parents. Please make sure to read them carefully. You can download them <u>HERE</u>.

Here is a quick summary of the general rules:

- Lessons start at 08:15 for P3 up to S7, at 09:00 in Nursery and at 09:05 in P1 and P2.
- Pupils and staff shall dress appropriately and wear indoor shoes while inside the school building.
- Staff and parents must wear, at all time, Staff badges and Parents badges while in the school premises.
- Pupils from P1 to S3 must go out, in the school yard, during the midday break after having lunch in the school canteen.
- Eating is only allowed in the canteen, even for the food/snacks brought from home.
- NB! No deliveries of food are accepted at school during school time.
- Energy and soft drinks, junk food, smoking, drugs, alcohol, and any form of weapon are not allowed on any part of the premises of TES at any time and by any person.
- At the beginning of the school year, by request from parents and with the authorisation given by the Secondary Deputy Director, the pupils from S4 up to S7 may leave the school premises. Secondary pupils will receive a coloured sticker as follows:
  - S6-S7: green sticker, can leave during free periods and lunchtime;
  - S4-S5: blue sticker, can leave during lunchtime;
  - S1-S3: red sticker, cannot leave the school premises during school hours.
- The use of the school diary (provided by TES) is compulsory for all Primary and Secondary pupils.
- Mobile phones are NOT allowed during school hours, including lunch time. Specific exeptions are detailed in our <u>IT Policy</u>.



• Any member of school staff has the right to confiscate any electronic gadget if the rule above is not respected.

## Access, Gates and Badges

In order to maintain the school environment safe, every staff member and pupils from Primary 1 to Secondary 7 must carry a personal badge to open the gates and the school's front door.

In Nursery and Primary both parents can have badges on request by contacting our Administrative Assistant/Laboratory Technician Ülari Taavel (<u>ylari.taavel@est.edu.ee</u>).

Parents of children in Primary 3, 4, and 5 should inform the Class teacher if their child/ren is/are allowed to leave school on their own. P1 and P2 pupils must be picked up by their parents or a guardian. The Class teacher and the front-desk administration should be informed in writing by the parents if the person picking up the child is not a parent. Pupils in Primary are not authorised to pick up younger siblings. Secondary students may pick up younger siblings if informed in writing by the parents.

If a badge is lost, or if you need any additional badge, you can ask for a new badge directly at the front desk or by sending an email to Ülari Taavel (<u>ylari.taavel@est.edu.ee</u>). Please note that this additional badge will cost 6.50 €.

## Canteen



Tallinn European School is catered by P.Dussmann Eesti OÜ

School lunch menus are prepared in accordance with health protection requirements stemming from a Minister of Social Affairs regulation on health protection requirements for catering in preschools and general schools.



For every school day, the canteen provides:

- Breakfast 1,20 euros/day
- Lunch 1,79 euros/day
- Afternoon snack 1,60 euros/day
- Nursery catering 32,51 euros/day

# **TES Student Council**

# **Coming to TES and Parking**

TES School building is located on <u>Tehnika street 18</u>, a few steps away from the Old Town, Telliskivi Creative District, and the central railway station of Balti Jaam. It is easily accessible by car, public transport, or by foot. Bike-parks are available for bikes and scooters next to the entrance.

## Coming by car

When coming by car, please note that for security reasons, it is not possible for parents and staff members to park in the schoolyard. There are several parking options in the surrounding area. It is possible to park along Tehnika street, on <u>Suve</u> and <u>Sügise</u> streets (in the City Centre/Kesklinn parking zone), or on the other side of the railway on <u>Rohu</u> or <u>Saue</u> streets (Free parking zone).

In the City Centre (Kesklinn) parking zone, parking is free of charge for 15 minutes if you indicate the starting time of parking in writing or using a parking clock on the windscreen of the vehicle in a visible area. Beyond 15 minutes, parking costs  $1,50 \notin$ /hour or  $0,025 \notin$ /minute (Mon-Fri, 07:00-19:00). It is possible to pay the parking with your smartphone (Smart parking) or SMS. Find out more about <u>parking in Tallinn</u> and <u>how to pay</u>. Parking in the streets on the other side of the railway is free of charge.

A <u>private car park (Citypark)</u> is also accessible next to the Park Inn by Radisson Hotel, on Paldiski road 4 (3,50 €/hour). Please note that the 15 minutes of free of charge parking does not apply to private car parks!

## Coming by public transport

The school is especially well-connected by public transport. The stop "Kelmiküla" is located in front of the school building and hosts 3 trolleybus lines (1,4 and 5) and 5 bus lines (22, 40, 41/41B, 43 and 59). It is located one stop away from Balti jaam, Tallinn central train station. <u>See the timetable of Kelmiküla stop</u>.

If you are registered as a Tallinn permanent resident, you can use public transport for free (including trains in the city) once you have registered your Smartcard that you need to validate. More information about the <u>Smartcard</u> and the <u>right</u> to travel for free.
